INTRODUCTION

It was a life spanning nine decades and more, witnessing changing eras and vastly different situations and periods. From the Princely state of Alwar and life under Maharajas, Mr. Khemchand moved to service in the State of Rajasthan, which was formed in phases with 19 princely states (including Alwar) and 3 chiefships coming together. This was the phase of integration and merger. From the early eras of 50's of Integration & Independence, spent mainly in the districts he moved to the State level responsibilities of 'development' in the fields of Agriculture, Irrigation, Power, PWD and State Enterprises and other Departments. After retirement in 1969, he saw his family growing up and settling in different parts of the country and other countries outside India, and lived through the political emergency of 1975, liberalization of the 90's and heralded the world into the 21st century. He led a full life.

In bits and pieces, he often told family and friends about his experiences, achievements, problems and his Kissas, but it is only now that we have the chance to look more closely at all the papers he has left behind.

It would appear that he has left behind 'trunks' of wealth, which we are now beginning to explore systematically. Less emotionally, more objectively, we are able to see him through his letters, certificates, diaries and numerous other records which were in his prized and 'possessive' collection. It is indeed a marvel to see that he kept his records with him in trunks and almirahs and nobody really knew more than what he chose to tell. In the process we learn not only about him and his life, but of his times, and understand the changes that have taken place over the years.

As we unravel the papers, we thought that the records/references kept by Mr. Khemchand would themselves be of great interest not only to his children, grand children and extended family and large circle of friends, but perhaps also to researchers, in the present or in the future. By consolidating them, we are able to make them more readily and easily available to the reading public.

The 'going through' of the papers has not been an easy process. Apart from the emotions, efforts have to be made to look at papers kept in a 'methodical' manner by him but 'here and there and every where' as far as we are concerned. Also, as the papers cover nine decades and more, it is not easy to read or handle them. Understanding and analysing them therefore becomes a challenging task.

One view could have been to first look through all the papers and then categorize and publish them under different topics, subjects and time periods. This could have been ideal, but would have tested our patience and the desire to see fairly quick returns. So we have chosen the alternative and easier path of collecting related type of papers and then bringing out small volumes in booklet size. These may not be sequential in the strict sense of the word, but in due course a pattern will emerge and grow, we hope. In fact many of the trunks are still to be opened and explored.

From 1935, when he joined service to 1969 when he retired, Mr. Khemchand remained an administrator to the core of his being. In fact he never let this be forgotten even after retirement and till the very end.

Though he served the IAS, as an officer of Rajasthan cadre, his heart and soul belonged to Alwar. That is where he was born and brought up, first posted, and where he served as Collector around the time of Independence. When we set up the Daya Lakshmi Trust in honour and memory of my mother Mrs. Dayavanti and grand mother Mrs. Lakshmi, he wanted major activities and institutions to be located in Alwar, a desire the Trust Members now strive to fulfill. The first volume is therefore about some of his educational attainments and orders/records that relate to Alwar. It is hoped that the other volumes will follow in quick succession, which relate to other postings, places and subjects.

The volume contains a brief sketch of Mr. Khemchand, followed by paper/records that relate to his education, postings and administration in Alwar. The Papers/records have been taken from Mr. Khemchand's personal collection as well as the Alwar State Archives. While full efforts have been made and precautions taken to interpret the records correctly, we take responsibility for any errors/mistakes that would have kept in unknowingly and would solicit more accurate/correct information.

We acknowledge with deep gratitude, the help rendered by the family members and also especially by the Collector Alwar, the Archives Department of Alwar, Mr. Anil Joshi (ex PA to several Collectors of Alwar) and to Mr. Pratap Narain, Mr. Lokesh and Mr. Kaluram who have helped in procuring these records.

भारतीय शासन विधान का क्या स्वरूप होगा इस और सभी साकांक्ष दृष्टि से देख रहे हैं और नरेन्द्रगण के समक्ष यह प्रश्न है कि उन्हें उक्त शासन में भाग लेना उचित है अथवा नहीं है और यदि है तो किस रूप से? विधान परिवर्तन में सममिलित होने की घोषणा हम कर चुके हैं और इसे सुस्पष्ट कर देना आवश्यक समझते हैं कि हमारा संकल्पित होना किसी स्वार्थ उत्पत्ता के लक्ष्य से नहीं किन्तु मुख्य प्रयत्न यह है कि समस्त देश के शासन की मशाली को ऐसा रूप देने में हमारा सहयोग हो सके जिससे वास्तविक सामाजिक हित हो अर्थात् देश को सुख शान्ति प्राप्त हो।

यह प्रत्यक्ष है कि वर्तमान समय में शासन प्रणाली का जो स्वरूप दिया जा रहा है वह वैदेशिक विधान के अनुसार है। इस सम्बन्ध में हमें सर्व प्रथम यह विचारने की आवश्यकता है कि क्या हमारे शास, पुराण, इतिहास यह सिद्ध नहीं कर रहे हैं कि किसी समय में भारत की राज नीति के अनुसार बर्दा के शासन का स्वरूप ऐसा रहा है जो इस कारण परम गृहणीय माना जा सकता है कि उसके आधार पर शासक और शासित सभी वास्तविक सुख का अनुभव करते थे। हम तो उच्च स्तर से यह घोषणा करते हैं कि हमारा प्रयत्न यह होना उचित है कि यथा सम्भव अपनी शासन प्रणाली को अपनाते और उजा को सर्वथा सुखी रखने का लक्ष्य अपनी दृष्टि के समक्ष रहे। देश की प्रगति किसी से प्रवृत्त नहीं है। ऐसे अवसर पर पारस्परिक बेमनस्य की अपेक्षा सीमन्त को स्थान देना परमावश्यक है। हमें मि० जिनता का यह कथन प्रशंसनीय प्रतीत हुआ कि अल्पसंख्यक प्रजा जन (Minorities) की रक्षा हमारा उद्देश्य ही कर्तव्य होगा जितना बहु संख्यक प्रजा जन (Majority) का, परन्तु साथ ही अल्प संख्यक प्रजा का भी यह कर्तव्य होगा कि वह राज भक्ति में किसी से परवान पद न रहे। राज्य शासन मन्त्री विशेष विवरण सुर्मत कर ही चुके हैं। सर मिरमन्न पापना अस्वास्थ्य के कारण विशेष राज्य सेवा न कर सके। संतोष इस बात का है कि सुर्मत के पद पर कार्य करने के लिये हमें डॉ० खरे जैसे अनुभवी मन्त्री उपलब्ध हो गये हैं जो सी. पी. के प्रधान मन्त्री तथा भारत सरकार के मन्त्री मण्डल के सदस्य रह चुके हैं। इनकी योग्यता के कारण ही हमने उन्हें भारतीय शासन विधान में अपने राज्य के प्रतिनिधि के रूप में नियुक्त कर दिया है।



सिद्धार्थ (Revenue Minister) के रूप में डाक्टर साहसिब और Additional Minister के रूप में डाक्टर महादुरसिंह की नियुक्ति भी इसी भाषा से की गई है कि ये दोनों भी अपनी योग्यता का परिचय देते हुए शासन कार्य में उत्तमि दिखाते रहें।

राज्य के आर्थिक व्यय का परिचय से यह स्पष्ट है कि वार्षिक राजा उल्लोचनक है।

अपनी सेना के कार्य की प्रशंसा भारत सरकार के Commander-in-Chief, Military Adviser-in-Chief तथा अन्य उच्च पदाधिकारियों ने समग्र २ पर की है, हमें यह देख कर बड़ा उत्सव होता है कि राज्य की आन्तरिक तथा सीमा-प्रदेशीय शांति रक्षा में हमारे सैनिकों ने अपना सर्वश्रेष्ठ प्रयत्न करते हुए राज्य के आर्थिक गौरव को सुरक्षित रखा है। अब हम सेना की वृद्धि की ओर विशेष ध्यान दे रहे हैं। इसी कारण हमने सेनापति के रूप पर कर्नल अमरसिंह की, जो इस कार्य में अनुभवी हैं, नियुक्ति की है और सेना का कार्य प्रत्येक से हमने स्वयं अपने हाथों में ले लिया है। अल्पिन में सेना का सम्बन्ध किसी मंत्री से न रह कर अर्द्ध नयेय के हाथों में ही रहेगा। अब सेना मंत्री का पद ही नहीं रखा गया है।

सुप्रीमकोर्ट (Judiciary) को (Executive) एकत्रित करने से प्रथम किया जाना एक विशेष विधान के आकार पर है जिसके द्वारा की जाती है कि न्याय-शासन में सुधार रहेगी। हमें यह देख कर प्रसन्नता है कि Mr. S. C. Chatterjee Retired High Court Judge Patna इस समय Chief Justice के रूप पर नियुक्त हैं जिनसे यह पूर्ण ज्ञान की जाती है कि न्याय शासन का कार्य सुचारु रूप से सम्पन्न हो सकेगा।

राज्य में ज्ञान में M. A. और LL. B. की शिक्षा प्रारम्भ की जा रही है और यह देख कर विशेष उत्सव न होगा कि न केवल प्रारम्भिक और माध्यमिक किन्तु उच्च शिक्षा में भी उत्तमि हो रही है। की शिक्षा की ओर भी उचित रूप से ध्यान दिया जाएगा।

कार्य प्रवर्धनी के इन अनेक संशोधन में से यह एक परमावश्यक संशोधन है कि अल्पिन न्यायालयों तथा कार्यालयों में कर्मचारियों पर व्यवहार के पारिचित सब कार्य हिन्दी में ही किया जाये। अल्पिन महाराज ने इस सम्बन्ध में जो आदेश प्रस्तावित किया था उसका अनुपालन कुछ समय से शिथिल हो गया था। परन्तु इसे पुनः सक्रिय बनाना परमावश्यक है। महाराज ने जो आदेश स्थापित किया था उसके अन्तर्गत हमें कोई संशय नहीं। यह परम हर्ष का विषय है कि भारतीय विज्ञान परिषद ने भी आज उही विधान को स्वीकार किया है।

नवीन रेलवे योजना का विषय हमारे समक्ष है और इस प्रस्ताव को कार्य रूप में परिचित करने के लिये Mr. T. G. R. Egan Railway Engineer की नियुक्ति की है।

डा० मदानि सिंह जी गढ़ी जो इस समय सुपरिटेन्डेंट पुलिस हैं हम इनको D. I. G. Police के रूप पर नियुक्त करते हैं।

राष्ट्रीयता के सम्बन्ध में जो चर्चा की गई है हमें इस विषय में केवल बही कहना है कि यह तो वही है जिनके सुसंस्कारों का अर्थ यह संकल्प रहा है कि राष्ट्रीयता की रक्षा की जाय इसी विधान के अनुपालन में हमने यह घोषणा की थी कि जो राष्ट्रीयता के रूप में हमारे राज्य में आयेगा जाति, धर्म, भेद का विचार पर कोई विचार न करके उसकी रक्षा की जायेगी। इसी विषय में राज्य की ओर से उनकी रक्षा का तथा साम्य प्रकल्प किया जा रहा है। हमको बहुत प्रसन्नता है कि हमारे प्रजासत्तव ने भी पूर्ण सहयोग दिया है।

शासन सम्बन्धी मिनट २ विभागों और कार्यालयों की विशेष चर्चा न करके हमें सामान्य रूप से केवल यही कहना है कि मिनट के हाथों में शासन सम्बन्धी कार्य दिया गया है उन्हें न केवल यह देखना आवश्यक है कि क्या कार्य सम्पन्न हुआ है अथवा यह विचार करना भी परमावश्यक है कि क्या कार्य सम्पन्न नहीं हो सका है और उसकी सम्पन्नता के लिये क्या प्रकल्प उचित है और उस प्रकल्प के करने में शिथिलता न हो कर उत्तरदायी आवश्यक है।

“राजा” इस शब्द की व्याख्या हमारे शासकों में तो संक्षेप रूप से इन शब्दों में की गई है—“राजा प्रकृति रक्षकनाम” अर्थात् राजा को प्रकल्प रक्षक से ही राजा कहना है।

हम अल्पिन में श्री अविद्वान्द्वय भगवान् रामचन्द्र जी के चरित्रों में प्रशंसित करते हुए वही प्रार्थना करते हैं कि हमारे शासन से हमारी प्रजा सदा कर्षता सुखी रहे।

उत्तम सेवकों के उल्लेख में जिन को पारिचित प्रधान किया जायेगा उसकी योजना सुन्दरिम् अन्वेषिकाय द्वारा होगी।


